ENGLISH EXTRACTS.

On the 25th July, the Queen received the Duchess of Braganza, 'ex-Queen of Portugal and ex-Empress of the Bravils, who, with the princess her daughter, (si ter in law to the Queen Regent of Portugal,) and a very merous suite, disembarked from the Lightning steamer on the same morning at Woolwich. The Queen Dowager Adelaide visited this distinguished party, on the same day, at Mivart's hotel.

Charles Willet, who insulted Queen Victoria on the 17th July, was ordered to pay £5 for the assault on Her Majesty's outrider, and bound over to keep the peace to the Queen's subjects, and especially her servants. His youth was pleaded in excuse of his misconduct. A new Catholic Charch, which cost thirty thousand pounds, was lately opened at Everningham, with a procession of priecis and bishops, the Pop's banner, the host, c. in great splendour.
