OTTAWA, ONT.—Negotiations are still on foot looking to the construction of the Bank street subway; estimated cost, \$60,000.—Tenders are wanted by April 4th for repairs to By-Ward market.—It is stated that H. A. Bate intends building a modern apartment house on corner of Bank and Nepean streets, to be brick, of fire-proof construction, four storeys, with 24 suites of rooms, besides a number of single apartments.—G. M. Bayly has been selected as architect for proposed addition to police station; estimated cost, \$10,000.

CHATHAM, ONT.—J. L. Wilson & Son, architects, want tenders by 4th inst. for erection of brick school house in S. S. No. 6, Chatham Township.—J. L. Wilson & Son, of this city, and W. P. Witton, of Hamilton, have prepared plans for new hotel to be built by the Chatham Mineral Water Co. in connection with the Mineral bath-house.—It is expected that one of these plans will be accepted and that the building will cost about \$40,000.—Howard Township Council have instructed W. T. McGeorge, C. E., to report upon the cost of a bridge to be built over the Duffis Creek, River road.—A petition is being circulated asking for a vitrified brick pavement on King street west.
