Ordered, That this Resolution be sent to his Majesty's Council for Concurrence

Then the House adjourned till To-morrow Morning 9 o'Clock.

Wednesday June 25th, 1777.

His Majesty's Council returned the Bill " for the Payment of the Representatives of the several Counties and Towns within this Province,

Not agreed to.

The Committee appointed to present the several Addresses of this House to his Honor the Lieut. Governor, reported, that they had presented the same, and that his Honor was pleased to say, that he would take into Consideration the Matters therein contained.

His Majesty's Council sent down, a Bill for continueing the Act, made in the 15th Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled, An Act to impower the Governor Lieut Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, Arms and Ammunition or Salt Petre, or carrying the same Costways to which they desire the Concurrence of his House.

And the faid Bill was read and agreed to,

His Majesty's Council acquainted the House by Message, that they agree to the Estimate for the Expences of Government, and to the several Resolutions and Votes of this House for Payment of money to the several Persons therein mentioned.

Ordered, that Mr. Speaker do request his Honor the Lieut. Governor will please to order a write to be issued for electing a Member of this House for the Township of Yarmouth, in the room of James Monk, Esqr, who is gone to reside at Quebec.

A Message came from his Honor the Lieut. Governor requiring the

Attendance of the House in the Council Chamber.

And Mr. Speaker with the House having attended accordingly, his Honor was pleased to give his affent to the following Bills:viz.

Also to the report of the joint Committee of his Majesty's Council

and of this House on the publick Accounts.

To the Estimate for the Expences of Government for the Year

1777.

And to the feveral Resolutions and Votes for Payment of money to fundry Persons as agreed to by his Majesty's Council and this Hovse

After which his Honor was pleased to make the following SPEECH.
