GREETING:

NOW ye, that I, the faid Lieutenant-Governor, by virtue of the power and authority in me vested, have constituted and appointed, and do, by these Presents, constitute and appoint, the Honorable Richard John Uniacks, His Majesty's Attorney General, and the Honorable James Stewart, and the Honorable Brenton Halliburton, to be a Commissioner or Commissioners, or either of them, to tender and administer the usual State Oaths according to Law to all and every person and persons who is, are, or shall be elected a Member of the House of Assembly in this Province, giving them, or either of them, sull power and authority to person the matters herein before mentioned, ratifying and consirming all and whatsoever the said Commissioners, or either of them, shall do and person this behalf.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereto set my Hand, and caused my Szal at Arms to be hereto affixed, at Halifax, this tenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty's Reign.

The faid Commissioners came, between eleven and twelve o'clock, into the Room of the new Province House, appropriated for the Members of the House of Assembly to sit in, and the foregoing Members returned by the several Sheriffs, who all appeared before the said Commissioners, took the usual Catha prescribed by Law, and subscribed the usual Declaration, in their presence.

After which, a Message was delivered from His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by Mr. Secretary George, to acquaint the Members that it was His Excellency's pleasure they should proceed to choose a sit person to be their Speaker, and to present the Member shoken

for His Excellency's approbation.

Mr. Mortimen then proposed to the House, Simon Bradstreet Robie, Esq. His Majesty's Solicitor-General, and Member for the County of Halisan, for their Speaker: and the choice of the House having unanimously fallen upon the said Simon Bradstreet Robie, he stood up in his place, and expressing the honor proposed to be conferred on him by the House,
