The teacher's salary in Canada, and especially in Ontario, as compared with salaries given in other spheres, ranked lowest. 

130 CASES OF SMALL-POX.

"Is there any such thing as a gen-"Is there any such thing as a gen-uine case of small-pox in this part of the country?" was the question asked Dr. C. A. Hodgetts, Provincial Health Inspector, Toronto, by The Planet. "Oh, yes. Why, if you will only come down where I have been staying for the last four weeks I will show you about one hundred and thirty cases, divided among Tilbury East, West and North, and also in Maidstone and Ro-chester. These cases have nearly all North, and also in Maidstone and Ro-chester. These cases have nearly all been smouldering since last summer, and although they are all very light attacks, they are, nevertheless, small-pox, and typical of the disease that has been going through the United States and Mexico during the last

year."
"Where do you think it originated "Where do you think it originated and how long do you think it will be before it is wiped out?"
"Well, as near as I can see, it same from Toledo, or thereabouts, and as for the epidemic, I think that all the cases will be cured by the first of the year. We have them all strictly quarantined and there is no chance for it

"There is one thing that I want you to understand, and that is, if any one says there are no cases of small-pox in that part of the country they are very much mistaken."
