RE-ESTABLISHING CANADA'S DOLLAR

It is good news to hear that the Canadian Government intends to pay off completely a debt of \$25,000,000 at maturity in New York on April 1st next.

The sooner the Canadian people are rid of their obligations, public and private, to the United States, the sooner shall we recover our commercial independence.

With the present balance of trade and exchange against us, we are paying tribute, though unwillingly, to our rich neighbors. The latter have, during the past year, invested an enormous capital in order to establish and develop industries in this country.

We soon shall feel the benefit of this monetary immigration. As production increases on this side of the frontier, our credit will be re-established. Now more than ever the wisdom of the proverb is manifest: "Who pays his debts enriches himself."

All the large railroads in New England have decided to reduce the wages of their employes. They have set April 4 as the date on which this reduction is to go into effect, giving the men one month's notice of the change.
