Each purchaser will receive a Verification Certificate with an extension coupon, which when signed at Winnipeg by a farmer showing the holder has been engaged to work as a Farm Laborer, will be honored for a Free Ticket to any station in Manitoba or Saskatchewan, Southwest, Northwest or West of Winnipeg, fo and including Moosejaw, Swan River and Kamsack. And from these points to Calgary and McLeod, including Strathcona and McLeod Branches, and from Regina to points on the Prince Albert Branches, tickets will be issued at one cent per mile.
