MANY MOTIONS COME BEFORE THE COMMONS

Members to Hear Many Resolutions Within the Next Few Days—Have Been Delayed.

Ottawa, March 25.—Resolutions of private members will engage the attention of Parliament this afternoon, Monday being set apart for the business of members for several weeks subsequent to the conclusion of the debate on the address. Private members have a long list of resolutions and motions for returns on the order paper, and several of them are likely to be considered to-day.

There is a possibility that the estimates may be reached for the first time before the House adjourns, and if they are the civil Government votes will be taken up. The fiscal year expires in another week and nothing has yet been voted of the estimates tabled to cover the cost of conducting the business of the country during the fiscal year commencing April 1. An interim supply bill covering probably one-sixth of the whole estimates will likely be agreed upon by the Government, and Opposition, at the end of the week. This would provide the Government with all the funds required until the end of June. Consideration of the \$350,000,000 war appropriation resolution will also be moved by the Minister of Finance at an early date. It is likely to be debated of some length.

A PANIC PREVAILS IN BUDAPEST

(Special To The Journal.)
Copenhagen, March 25.—The claims of the Hungarian Soviet Government to power, as set forth in its wireless communications are largely untrue, according to a Vienna despatch. A panic prevails in Budapest, but the country, it is declared, has not yet resolved upon a Soviet republic.

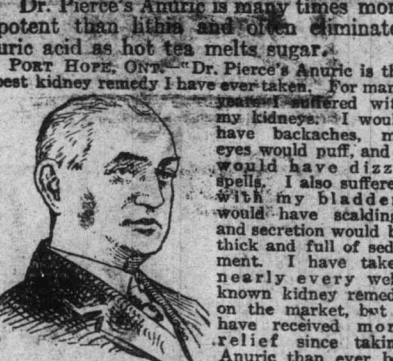

Bridgeburg, Ont., March 25.—Bridgeburg's soldier lads are beginning to return home from France. Captain John McClelland, who went overseas with the 76th battalion and saw considerable service in France, is back. Privates James Hildreth and William Hart also returned yesterday. Private Bud, who went overseas in July, 1916, with the 98th and was wounded at Bulgegnade in January, 1917, and again at Arras in February, 1918, has returned. He spent 23 months in the trenches.

HON. W. J. HANNA LAID TO REST TO-DAY

Sarala, March 25.—Business in this city was suspended and the noise of traffic hushed while the remains of Hon. W. J. Hanna, one of her prominent sons, were interred this afternoon. Thousands viewed the body as it lay in state at the Methodist Church here today.

WILL PROBE THE DEWART ALLEGATIONS

Sir William Meredith Will Head Royal Commission to Investigate Aycerst Charges

Sir William Meredith has consented at the request of the Government to probe Mr. Hartley Dewart's charges against Chief Justice Aycerst, Premier Hearst announced shortly after the opening of the Legislature yesterday afternoon. He stated that Mr. Peter White, K.C., had been engaged to assist the commission. Pending investigation, Mr. J. E. Aycerst has been suspended by the Government, and George A. Morrison an inspector of the department has tendered his resignation. The accounts of the License Department for the last six years will be referred to the public accounts committee, and Sir William guaranteed that the fullest latitude will be exercised in conducting the examination.

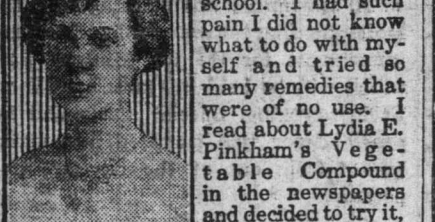
FIRE DESTROYS PARK
