WHERE THE MONEY GOES.

The Sun's "Own Correspondent" an Admit at "Raising."

The St. John Sun of Tuesday last, under the heading, "where the Money Goes," publishes a very garbled account of the amounts expended on the bridges of the province, and in connection with the lumber business. If the Sun's statement is compared with the printed report issued by the board of works, a person will at once come to the conclusion that the editor of that journal has been playing ten cent 'ante' in his dreams, and has given his readers the benefit of his ravings; or that he has fallen a victim to some of the many afflictions which weak minds are peculiarly subject.

The singular fact is evident from a comparison of the reports that the Sun's editor is an adept at "raising." Ten dollars under his machinations loom up into a hundred with one stroke of the pen. Sixteen dollars are raised to sixty-six, and so on. A change in the figures is made, and the thought of a moment, yet it with others helps to prove the assertion that the editor has allowed his imagination to run riot.

These are only samples of the mistakes which occur in this column. And the Sun wishes to convey the idea that the statement has been copied from the official record. It is painfully evident that the proof reader is at Ottawa earning his wages, and the devil has been sent to run the paper in the meantime. It is all very well, as offices get short handed occasionally, but in such cases it would be just as well to let provincial finances alone. The Sun's readers will do well to accept its statements, especially while the house is in session, with a very large grain of salt.

The Sun also in its Thursday issue agonized over the amount paid T. H. Huxley printing and publishing company for public printing. The Sun should be satisfied with its \$46 a day from Ottawa without wishing to scoop in the whole business.

At City Hall.

Hon. James Mitchell.

The following sketch of the provincial secretary is from the St. Andrews Beacon: "Hon. James Mitchell, Q. C. M. A., is a son of William Mitchell, who came from Inverkip, Scotland, to Scotch Settlement, York County, in 1827. He was born there in 1843, and was educated at the Fredericton Collegiate School. He was called to the bar in 1870, and was inspector of schools for Charlotte county from 1872 to 1875 and from 1877 to 1879. He has been secretary of the St. Stephen school board and a census commissioner. Mr. Mitchell was married in 1873 to Miss Ryder, of St. Stephen. He was first elected to the legislature in 1882, and was made Surveyor General when the present government came into office in 1883. He was re-elected by acclamation, and was again returned in 1890 and 1896, in the latter year becoming Provincial Secretary. He is a Conservative.

Daring Burglary.

Some time on Saturday night or Sunday morning the drug store of Davis, Staples & Co., corner York and Queen street, was entered. It appears that the burglars broke a pane of glass in the York street window and then reaching in unfastened the window so that they had an easy entrance. They then helped themselves to about seventy dollars worth of liquor, cigars, pipes and perfumes, and departed. It is not known what time they entered as although there was someone in the shop all night yet they knew nothing about the affair.

The rear passenger car and the bark car were both thrown from the track. The passenger car is yet lying on its side there but will be removed this afternoon. The track and switch were also torn up. It was the worst accident that has ever happened the road at this end of the line.

A plump and well developed ham of the yellow canvass style disappeared mysteriously from the store of George Whelpley one day at the close of last week. The police were notified, and on Monday were attracted by the sweet and savory odor of fried pork to the classical residence of Mr. Jones where, devoid of its pristine beauty, the ham was found. THE SCHOOLS.

From the Report of the Chief Superintendent.

The report of the chief superintendent of education for the province shows that the marked advance has been made in the schools both in the work done during the year and in the increase in the number of pupils attending. A glance at the following table gives the number of schools, teachers and pupils for the second term of 1891 and the first term of 1892, as follows:

The number of pupils present for the year was 68,000 or about one-fifth of the total population of the province. The average daily attendance for the term ending December 1891, was 33,233, an increase of 1,327 over the corresponding term of the year previous. The average attendance for the year exceeds that of any year since the change in the school law. The chief superintendent leads the other counties in the average attendance, averaging 71.23 for the year. The other counties averaged about 50 per cent. In the cities and incorporated towns Fredericton led during the year, though led by St. Stephen during the last term.

There were 1,674 teachers employed for the last term of 1891, of whom 290 were first class and 815 second class; average salaries for first class male teachers was \$663.76; for second class \$302.94; and third class \$225.33. The total amount of provincial grants to teachers for the year was \$142,981.21.

DEATH OF HON. JOHN MCADAM.

A Member of the Reform Legislature of 1884.

One of the best known residents of Charlotte Co., Hon. John McAdam, died at St. Stephen on Monday the 13th inst., at the age of eighty-three. Though not for years past taking an active interest in the politics of his native province, yet he was keenly alive to all events transpiring in the political arena. Mr. McAdam was a member of the reform legislature of 1884, and held the position of question of responsible government, and a few interruptions he was a representative of the county of Charlotte in the legislature until 1871.
