Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations

Any person who is the sole head of family, or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section evailable Dominion land in Manliob Saskatchewant or Alberta. The appl minion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy ma be made at any agency, on certain

and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may liv farm of at least 80 acres sol and occupied by aim or by his father mother, son, daughter, brother or sis-

good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price 2.00 per acre

Duties-Must reside upon the hom atead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of home-atead entry (including the time required a homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acros extra.

A homesteader ,who has oxhauste his homestead right and cannot obtai a pre-emption may enter for a purchas ed homestead in certain districts. Pric \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside eix months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
