

Ask for Delivery of Foxes

RECOVERY SOUGHT BY INVESTORS AGAINST DR. GORDON.

BANGOR, Me. Aug. 12.—Dr. Frank Gordon, of Bangor, former defendant in the case which was settled during the federal investigation in February last, had sold to investors contracts for delivery of foxes worth of "silver foxes" contracts to investors in New England, is defendant in several actions entered in the Superior Court here by New York persons who seek to get an injunction against him and the Frank H. Gordon.

First Court Action.
Attempts to be made by investors to get their foxes or dividends in many cases have been said to be long overdue, have been numerous for many months. The first action at court action, however, is the one now taken by eight investors in Bangor.

Among the things demanded are that Dr. Gordon be obliged to make good and true answer to the following:—
1.—On what possession are the foxes?
2.—What is the exact arrangement between defendant as an individual and as a corporation, on the foxes?
3.—On what ranches and in what parts are the foxes and how can they be identified?

Ask for Delivery of Foxes.

The petitioners ask for a delivery of their foxes and an injunction enjoining Dr. Gordon or the corporation from any transfer or assignment of the foxes or from anything which will confuse the identity of the foxes.
Applications in the writs entered are that the plaintiffs were guaranteed 100 per cent. offspring on the foxes. It is alleged that the breeding season is over and that the period for the contract is past but that the plaintiffs have been unable to get their foxes. It is also alleged that frequent demands have been made for information as to the location and identification of the foxes but that all demands have been refused. The plaintiffs allege specific dates upon which demands were made for foxes. Dates are also given upon which it is alleged the plaintiffs were refused information which would enable them to identify their foxes.

Total Amount \$51,500.

George F. Eaton, city solicitor here entered on the equity court docket here as attorney for the investors in the actions started to-day. The investors, all people outside the State of Maine, who have commenced action here are:

James M. Kitter of Short Hills, N. J.; Bertival C. Reed of New York City; Harry G. McKillop of New York City; Edward Froelich of New York City; Peter E. Farnum of New York City; Louis F. Attached to each writ filed in the clerk of courts office here is the contract showing the amount of money invested in the foxes. The total amount in the eight cases is \$51,500.

Dr. Gordon, according to an announcement last week, has turned over his interests in the Bangor Commercial, which until two weeks ago carried the caption, "Dr. F. H. Gordon, sole owner," to Erastus Tefft of New York and Colonel Harry F. Ross, formerly of Bangor.

Will Watch Proceedings.

Men and women in all walks of life will watch with interest the proceedings in the Supreme Court. Thousands of people here and to the North East, West and South are fox owners. Transfers recently made of Dr. Gordon's personal property, mortgages placed upon his home on Maple Street and personal attachment from a local bank, and other incidents that would be unlooked in the case of the average business man here are circled like wild-fire by the hundreds anxious to know the fate of the "wonderman" and their foxes.
