The Painters' union of this city has agreed upon a new scale of wages which was endorsed at a meeting of the Trades and Labor Council last night and will be submitted to the Master Painters' association today providing greater wages and less hours of work each day. That a strike will result is not considered likely, because with the great amount of work now on hand, it is thought the employers will prefer to grant the demand or com-promise rather than tie up operations. The journeymen say that in asking for more wages they are simply making an effort to keep pace with the in-creased cost of living. 
