Good Times at Hand.
Western Wire and Nail Factory Dou-
bling Their Plant—Planning Mill
Enlargement.

Already London's manufacturers are
springing ahead under the impulse of
the Liberal Government. The Hobbs
Manufacturing Company are extending
their premises and doubling their
plant for the manufacture of nails and
galvanized wire fencing. They fear no
depression in trade.

This increase of plant means a cor-
responding increase of hands employ-
ed. The company is also setting apart
another portion of their premises for
the manufacture of bicycles, which
they will go into this fall on a large
scale.

The machinery and plant for the
enlarged nail factory is already at the
Grand Trunk freight depot, awaiting the
completion of the building on
Ridout street.

Soldiers at the barracks are talking

rier, behind which he finds shelter
from the deadly Lee-Netford bullet,
he was flag provided for that
purpose. The signal is answered by a
blast from the bugler attached to the
company, and then it is safe to
leave the shelter, as firing gradually
ceases. Pte. Moore, on this occasion,
made the usual signal with the flag,
but the answering bugle call did not
come as quickly as he thought it
should. The shooting, too, appeared
to have died away, and the soldier
stepped out from behind the shelter.
Just as he did so a bullet landed in
three feet of where he stood. Pte.
Moore is one of the bravest of Can-
ada's soldiers, but under those cir-
cumstances he could be excused for
retreating.

MONUMENT UNVEILED.
A handsome monument erected by

memory of a deceased sovereign, the
late George Hampton, who met death
