## Albert Walker Will Be Deported Pleaded Guilty To Theft Charges

But Doesn't Want To Go Back  
To England Branded  
a Thief.

"I am a thief. I have only been over from England about a year, but I do not want to be sent back, branded a felon."

So said Albert Walker, the young Englishman, arrested recently at Fempo, when arraigned before Judge Macbeth today for election of trial, after having been committed this morning by Squire Chittick.

Walker pleaded guilty to stealing a watch, bought several years ago for \$50, an overcoat, and \$26 in money.

He was remanded for one week, while the local authorities get in touch with the department of immigration in reference to deporting him.

His honor said that in case Walker was sent back to England his sentence would be a light one, otherwise he may be rather severely punished.

"Squandered It."

Walker, when asked by Judge Macbeth what he had done with the money he had stolen, said he had squandered

it on a girl, whose identity he refused to reveal. Walker said that he was a plumber in Addington, England, prior to coming to this country a year ago last April. His father is a retired merchant. For a time after his arrival Walker worked on a farm near Wallaceburg, position having been procured for him by the Salvation Army, which, however, did not ship him into Canada.

Later Walker was employed as a cook at a salary of \$3 a week and his board by the Southwestern Traction Company on its construction work between St. Thomas and Port Stanley.

He said that he had worked for the traction company almost all of last summer. He had spent his savings buying nice things for the girls, he said.

Last January he went to work for a farmer at \$10 a week and he agreed to pay him from \$1 to \$2 a week. Up until a week ago last Friday, when he became a thief and ran away, the farmer, Walker alleged, had paid him exactly 50 cents.

"It would have paid you to have worked at plumbing if that is all you could earn at farming," replied his honor dryly.
