Popular Public Man of St. Thomas Announces Intention To Enter Race.

OPPOSED BY RAVEN

ST. THOMAS, Dec. 12.—Mayor Frank S. Brinkman, who has occupied the post of chief magistrate of this city for two years with distinct success, yielded to the urgings of his large circle of friends tonight and officially announced that he would offer himself as candidate for a third term in the mayor's chair.

For many years there has been an understanding in civic circles that two years should be the limit to the mayor's office, so that in again seeking the office Mayor Brinkman is creating a precedent.
