Windsor Man Held In Death of Ohio War Veteran Found In Alley

WINDSOR, June 12.—Edward Campeau, 131 Aylmer avenue, Windsor, has been arrested and another man is being sought, following an investigation by Windsor police into the death of Charles Sauers, an inmate of the Soldiers' and Sailors' Home of Sandusky, O., whose body was found in an alley between Glengarry and Aylmer

When Sauers was found by the police his shoes lay beside him. It was thought that he had died from the effects of poisonous liquor, but an examination of his stomach failed to disclose the presence of any injurious agent. A coroner's jury later turned in a verdict of death by suffocation.

Windsor police say that Campeau made a statement that he and the man being sought had become intoxicated with Sauers in Campeau's basement. Later, according to the alleged statement, Campeau and the other man went out. When Campeau returned alone, he found Sauers apparently insensible and, unable to arouse him, placed him in the alley, police say they were told.
