Toronto Man Finds Pearl in Oyster Shell Which May be Worth \$5,000

TORONTO, Sept. 29.—Mr. E. E. Mann, of Dovecourt district, was probably the most surprised man in Toronto when he found a pearl as large as a small cherry on the inside shell of an oyster in a King street cafe. An offer of \$500 has already reported to have been made to Mr. Mann by a Toronto jeweler, but it will be sent to New York to be "skinned" before any offer will be considered. Jewelers who have seen the pearl say that it has no flaws it will be worth \$5,000.
