

Boys Killed In Stampede

False Alarm of Fire Causes Trampling to Death of Four Lads.

Distribution of Theatre Tickets Ends Fatally In Indianapolis.

Police Squad Was Unable to Handle the Panic Stricken Mob.

INDIANAPOLIS, April 17.—Frenzied by a false alarm of fire, several hundred people gathered in a narrow alleyway in the Masonic Temple, trampling to death four boys and probably fatally injuring several other children.

Long before the crowd for the distribution of free tickets, the stairs of Masonic Temple, on the southwest corner of Washington street and Capitol street, were crowded with pushing, yelling crowd of children, mostly newsboys, anxious to be first to receive a pass.

The dead were sent to a morgue for identification. The severely injured were sent to a hospital, while many who suffered slight injuries were sent home.
