England's Free Trade to Be Conditional.
Lord Salisbury has made several speeches of late and these have been read, they say, with interest to have seen that his mind is in a stage of evolution on the trade question.

In his Birmingham speech the other day Lord Salisbury indicated that he pointed out that there were three apparent conditions which must be satisfied before any trade agreement could be entered into.

The world is concerned, and has been for some years, that British public opinion has been running towards fair trade, and that Canadian public opinion is also running towards fair trade.

Protectionists in Canada are free to accept such an arrangement with the Empire, but in fact a limited reciprocity—a reciprocity in enumerated articles such as this journal has been running for some time.

We claim that the whole political complexion of the immediate future is to be in the way of limited reciprocity between many countries in unlike articles.
