North Toronto was a bone of contention. G. F. Martz referred to all questions, save the one with reference to the control of the liquor traffic.

The question was pressed to a vote and the main motion, on which the local candidates were in favor of the answer to the question.

The letters from the South Toronto candidates were next read. Mr. Howland refused to give any pledge as to the control of liquor traffic, promised to give the matter his careful consideration, but was in favor of a prohibitory law.

"I see that I have written a tender letter and have done as I intended," responded Mr. Burns, "and I have had enough of it."
