THE FINANCIAL WORLD.

The local money market is a little stiffer, with lenders trying to put call loans up a trifle.

The biggest deal in local speculative circles has been in Western Assurance. Since the first of the month dealings on the Toronto Exchange aggregate over 25,000 shares, and the stock has risen from 147 1/2 to 160 3/4. The bulk of the stock has been bought by the Cox interest. It is given out that the prospects of the company are remarkably good, and that it is intended shortly to pay dividends of 2 1/2 per cent every three months instead of 6 per cent semi-annually. Quarterly dividends of course are what small investors like, and it will be a good move. The stock yesterday, however, did not advance, and it seemed even difficult to sustain the price. The high price is an inducement to holders of the stock to sell, and many have taken advantage of the rise.

It is safe to say that the large amount of stock named has not all been transferred, or in other words there has been some "laundering" work in connection with the deal. As an insurance stock, netting only a trifle over 6 per cent, it is high enough.

The coal situation is not an enviable one. Dealers' prices in New York are \$2.75 per ton for stove and \$2.65 for chestnut, the lowest quotations since 1877. The President of the Lackawanna Road says there is a disposition on the part of the companies to adjust their differences, they being impressed with the importance of the situation.

Outside wheat markets were irregular yesterday. The May option sold down to 54c at Chicago, a decline of 4c as compared with a week ago. In Liverpool futures were easier, May closing 1/2d lower than yesterday.

WISH TO LOCATE IN TORONTO.

Several Propositions Considered at the City Hall.

The Committee for Manufacturing Sites met yesterday afternoon, Ald. Bell in the chair. W. T. J. Lee appeared for the Gendron Manufacturing Co., and asked for ten years' exemption from taxation for the company, on condition that 50 men be employed. The American Rattan Co., a competitor of the Gendron, has an exemption. The Canadian Cork Co. also applied for exemption. The merits of the applications will be reported on by a sub-committee. Charles Van Norman of the Rubber Shoe Co. of Toronto, whose works are at Foxe Harbour, addressed the committee. He said the head office is at 76 Bay-street, and this was one reason why they wished to locate in this city. The shipping facilities of Toronto were another consideration. About 200 hands are employed. A three-story building, 300 by 60 feet, would be erected, with outbuildings for varnish and cement manufacture. Offers for the location of the company had been received from Peterboro, Hamilton, St. Catharines, Thorold and West Toronto, but the company would prefer to come to Toronto. No other firm in Ontario manufactures rubber shoes, so there would be no trade interest adversely affected. Ald. Davies moved that the committee recommend the exemption of the building to be erected, and the real estate, from taxation. In reply to Ald. Burns, it was stated that free sites, taxation exemption and free water had been offered by other towns. Steam power would be employed here.
