ILLUSTRATIONS.

A sketchy wrap here illustrates beads, threaded or silk, etc. The back is over the texture, the front longer, the two pieces with the same heading. Pattern No. 3458.

No. 3459, price appropriate for a baby in silk or crepe. Repeat from star.

the back with cross pleats, the right side a's ornamented with a bead plaque; the back hangs straight on either side, with the centre part draped.

FIGURE NO. 11.—Patterns No. 3460, price 30 cents, offers a design appropriate for wash or woolen goods, the former being trimmed with embroidery and the latter with lace, galloon, braid, or silk balls around the drapery. The subsequent is of the usual shape with the upper portion draped to form a long rounded top, and the falling part being thickly powdered with the belt with a Bedouin fold in the center back.

#### KNITTING AND CROCHETING.

Knitted skirts for babies are preferred by many mothers to those of flannel. We see suitable for a child in short dresses. One and a half oz. of white cotton wool or fine Germantown is necessary, and a medium sized crochet hook. Make a chain of 156 stitches, ends with 1 ch.—1st round.

4 trills, then \* 3, all into one loop, 5 trills, then 2 loops, 5 trills. Repeat from star.

There ought to be 12 of these scallops, each divided by the hole which the missing of 2 makes. Repeat the above for 12




FIG. 11.—No. 3460—LADIES' TRIMMED SKIRT. PRICE, 30 CENTS.




FIG. 8.—No. 3463—LADIES' TRIMMED SKIRT. PRICE, 30 CENTS.

\*12th round. Miss 3 loops, and do 4 to 6 instead of 5. Repeat.—13th round. Miss 2 loops and do four t. c. Repeat.—15th round. Miss 1 t. c.—16th round. Miss 4 loops, 3 t. c. Repeat.—17th round. Miss 2 loops, 3 t. c. Repeat. Work 2 more rounds in this manner.—20th round. T. c into every loop. Sew to a plain knitted waist, straight band, or one of similar hemmed.

A crocheted edge (shown in Fig. 2 No. 22) is useful as a trimming or an edging, etc., to hats, quilts, etc. For the first named purpose use medium fine cotton and a small steel hook. Make a chain of 22 stitches and crochet as follows: 1st row. Pass the first 9 stitches, 1 s. c. on the following stitch, 9 chain; pass 6 stitches, 1 s. c. on the following stitch.—2d row, 3 chain; 11 double crochet around the following 9 chain; 5 chain; 1 s. c. on the middle stitch of the 9 passed by in the first row.

3rd row. 1 s. c. around the next 6 chain, 1 p. (p. consists of 4 ch and 1 s. c. on the preceding s. c.) 1 s. c. around the same 6 ch and 1 p. 1 s. c. 1 s. c. around the same 6 ch, 2 ch; 11 d. separated by 1 ch on the next 11 d. 5 ch; 1 s. c. on the first

foundation stitch.—4th row. 1 s. c. around the next 5 ch (1 p. and 1 s. c. around the same 5 ch), 3 times; wait 1 s. c. separated by 1 p. around each of the next 11 single chain; then 1 s. c. on the s. c. after the 3d p. in the preceding row.

5th row. 6 ch; 1 s. c. on the following 4th p. in the preceding row, 6 ch; 1 s. c. on the following 3d p. Continue to repeat the 2d and 3d rows in turn, but in every repetition work an additional p. scallop, proceeding from the middle p. in the 2d p. in the 4th row, for which

crochet 7 ch; connect to the 4th p. in the 4th row of the preceding pattern, then round the 7 ch, work 1 s. c. (1 p. and 2 s. c.) 5 times. Finish the lace with two rows worked lengthwise along the upper edge as follows.

1st row. 1 s. c. around the middle one of the 3 p. in the 3d row of the next pattern, 2 ch; 1 s. c. around the following p. 6 ch; 1 d. repeat from star to p.—2d row. 1 d. on the following 2d s. c. in the preceding row and 1 chain.

A knitted belt for ladies has been asked for, and is illustrated in Figure No. 52. Use black knitting silk and medium needles. When finished, sew to park colors that are
