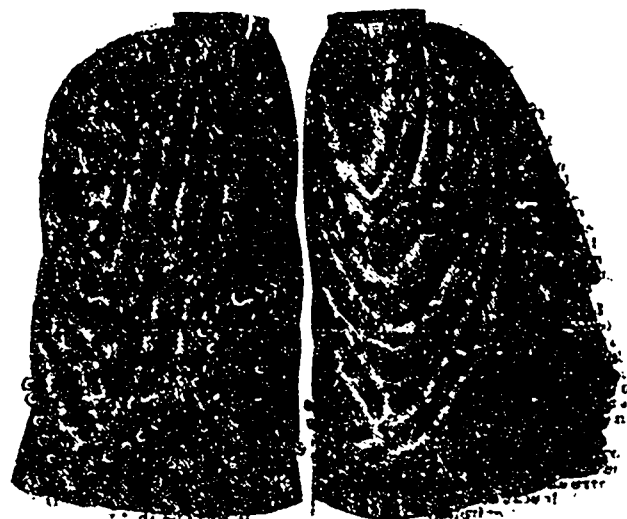


FIG. 11.—No. 3460 — LADIES' TENDRED

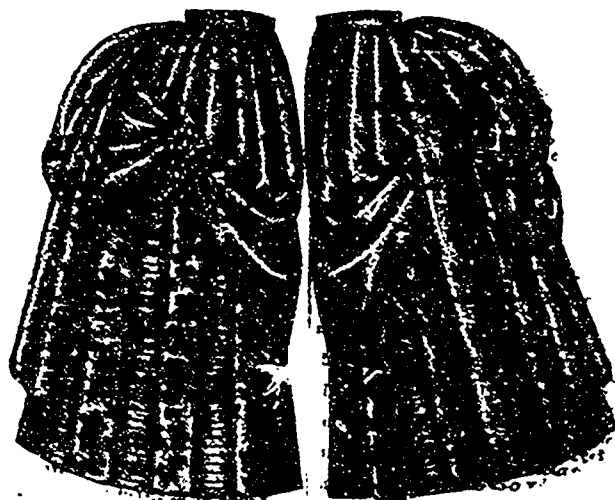


FIG 8—No. 3463.—LADIES' TRIMMED

FIGURES No. 11 — Pattern No. 3460, price 30 cents, offers a design appropriate for wash or woaden goods, the former being trimmed with satinoidery and the latter with lace, galloon, braid, or silk bells around the draperies. This pattern is of the usual shape with the upper part of draperies to form a long roning yoke, and ordinary falling in a point below, thickly gathered into the belt with a Bedouin fold in the center back.

KNITTING AND CROCHETING

Crocheted skirts for babies are preferred by many mothers to those of flannel. We give one suitable for a child in short dresses. One yoke and a half of white flannel wool or fine German wool is necessary, and a medium sized crochet hook. Make a chain of 168 stitches, unite with 2 a.—1st round. 4 treble, 3 then * 2, all into one loop, 5 treble, under 2 loops, 5 treble. Repeat from start. There ought to be 12 of these sections, each divided by the hole, which the making of 2 1/2" of 1/4" in. Repeat the above for 12
