Lumber freights remain without change at about previous quotations. tions are as follows :- From Burrard Inlet or Puget Sound to Sydney, 40s; Melbourne, Adelaide or Port Pirie, 47s 6d to 50s; Valparaiso, 45s; Cork for orders, 65s; China, 50s. Consequent upon the weakness of the wheat market the rate for grain has declined 2s 6d since last week, and is now quoted at 27s 6d from San Francisco to U. K., usual options. From Portland or Tacoma to U. K., usual options, the rate may be quoted nominally at 33s 9d for neck; in seeming; a scholar and a gentlevescels on spot and 40s for December can-A number of vessels have failed celling. to save their chartering dates and have gone to swell the list of disengaged tonnage at San Francisco. This has the effect of further depressing the market. On December 3rd the amount of disengaged tonnage, not including steamers, in port at San Francisco amounted to 42,022 tons, and the engaged tonnage, not including steamers, 139,216 tons.
