FINAL PROTOCOL TO THE PROVISIONS REGARDING THE CONVEYANCE OF LETTER MAILS BY AIR

I.

Air Transport Charges for Closed Mails.

The Administrations of British India and of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics have the option of collecting, for each section of their inland air service, the transport charges prescribed by Article 14.

· II.

Right of reducing the unit of weight for Air Mail correspondence.

Where the system of weights permits, Administrations have the right to adopt a unit of $^{\text{Weight}}$ less than that of 20 grammes prescribed by Article 5, § 2. In this case, the fee is fixed $^{\text{acc}}$ ording to the unit of weight adopted.

III.

Exceptional charges in favour of certain European Countries.

European Administrations, which, owing to the geographic situation of their territory, ^{ex}perience difficulty in adopting a uniform charge for the whole of Europe are authorised to ^{collect} charges proportionate to the distances, in accordance with the provisions of Article 5, § 2. This right is also accorded to the other European countries for their traffic with the countries ^{referred} to in the preceding paragraph.
