Born in 1951 in Hong Kong, Raymond Chan came to Canada in 1969 and became a Canadian citizen in 1974. He received a bachelor of applied science in engineering physics from the University of British Columbia.

As a professional engineer, Mr. Chan worked at the Triumf research centre at the University of British Columbia from 1977 to 1993. A restaurateur, he also owned and operated two small businesses from 1974 to 1989.
