The following Orders of the House were issued to the proper officers:-

By Mr. Marcil:—Order of the House for a copy of pay lists and accounts for materials for works performed by day labour in the county of Bonaventure, by the Department of Public Works, from May 26, 1932, to September 30, 1932.

By Mr. Mackenzie (Vancouver Centre), for Mr. Casgrain:—Order of the House for a copy of all correspondence, letters, telegrams, petitions and other documents, in possession of the Government, in connection with the ferry boat service between Baie-Ste-Catherine and Tadoussac in the county of Saguenay since the 1st of January, 1932, to date, including copy of the contracts for such boat service and the correspondence exchanged between the Department of Trade and Commerce and the Auditor General, with reference to the claim of Jean Claude Tremblay for services performed.

By Mr. Raymond:—Order of the House for a copy of all telegrams, complaints, correspondence, reports or other communications, in connection with the postmastership of the town of Beauharnois, the dismissal of Oscar Duquette, former incumbent, the appointment of his successor, since the month of August, 1930; also a copy of the report of the inquiry bearing on the dismissal of Oscar Duquette.

The Bill No. 6, An Act to amend the Customs Act, was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, reported without amendment, and ordered for third reading at the next sitting of the House.

The Bill No. 10, An Act to amend the Montreal Harbour Commissioners' Act, 1894, was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole reported without amendment, read the third time and passed.

The Bill No. 8, An Act respecting a certain Trade Agreement between His Majesty's Government in Canada and His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, was again considered in Committee of the Whole, and further progress having been made and reported, the Committee obtained leave to consider it again at the next sitting of the House.
