ONLY SEVEN WORDS MADE UP EVIDENCE

Milwaukee Man Denied That Phrase Implied Connection With Plot to Dynamite Works.

INDIANAPOLIS, Dec. 6.—(Can. Press.)—Seven words embraced in the phrase "Pretty hard to do anything o it," were produced by the government at the trial of the accused "bomb deters" today as its evidence that terman G. Seiffert, Milwaukee, was mplicated in the McNamara dynamite ansulrary.

conspiracy.

Seiffert, as one of the forty-one labor union officials charged with causing explosions on non-union work, had waited weeks to testify and he was on the stand less than 20 minutes expensively.

About a month before an explosion in Milwaukee on March 10, 1911, when an unloading hoist and a steamer near the dock were damaged by dynamite with \$50,000 loss, Seiffert took the place of Wm. E. Reddin, business agent of the ironworkers' union, who was sick for four days. During that time Seiffert wrote a letter to John J. McNamara, secretary of the International Ironworkers' Union at Indianapolis. Using that phrase, the witness said, he referred to efforts to unionize the job, for McNamara required reports from all local unions as to prospective work for members of the union. Seiffert asserted he first learned of the explosion from newspapers the following day. Ortic E. McManigal confessed to having actually placed the explosive.

Dr. McNamara, a Canadian Member of British Admiralty, Applauds Fellow-Countrymen's Spirit.

LONDON, Dec. 6.—(C.A.P.)—Dr. McNamara, a Canadian-born, minister of the admiralty, giving an opinion on Canada's gift, said: "We all must feel a thrill at reading of the splendid recognition by the eldest of the dominions of her vital stake in the integrity of the British Empire. The spirit of yesterday's proceedings at Ottawa was the finest tribute possible to statesmen who, in times past, laid the foundation of our empire. I've been five years at the admiralty and have witnessed untoid evidences of the determination of our brothers across the sea to maintain the empire intact, but I take great joy in the fact as a Canadian-born minister of the crown to pay tribute to the spirit which inspires the fellow-countrymen of the land of my birth."

Within the last few years the har within the last few years the harbor has frozen over as early as Dec. 6, and on more than one occasion on Dec. 8. The harbormaster declared that the reason the bay does not freeze over even earlier is owing to the fact that fifty million gallons of sewage are emptied into the bay every day. Not only does this keep the harbor open later in the year than would otherwise be the case, but it also causes the ice to break up much earlier in the spring.
