



This is \$2.083.147 more than for the same period of the preceding year, \$2-663,610 better than for the seven roonths of 1903-4, and a gain of \$5,539.249 as compared with the same seven months of 1902-3.

ANNUAL MEETING.

The Ninth Annual Meeting of the Shareholders of The Trusts and Guarantee Company, Limited, was held in the office of the Company, 14 King. street west, 1000010, on Wednesday, January 31st, 1906. There was a large attendance of the Shareholders present at the meeting. The President, Hon. J. R. Stratton, was asked by the Shareholders to take the chair, and the Managing Director, Mr. James J. Warren, acted as secretary.

After the notice convening the meeting had been read, the Report of the Directors was submitted, and the balance sheet read. The Statement showed that after the payment of the two half-yearly dividends, at the rate of 5 per cent. Per annum, amounting to \$49,973.46, a balance was carried forward to Profit and Loss of \$18,029.21, making a total of \$118,342.80 at the credit of Profit and Loss Account on December 31st, 1905. The Directors' Report showed that the Company's business continued to show a satisfactory growth. The paid up capital at the end of 1905 stood at \$1,037,883.71.

In moving the adoption of the Report the President Mr. Stratton, point, ed out of the gross receipts on account of the earnings of the Company for the past year amounted to \$116.497.46, leaving a balance of \$68,002.67, after deducting all expenses of management, as the net profits for the year. He also showed that two dividends had been paid, amounting to \$49,373.46, leaving a handsome sum to be carried forwardto Profit and Loss Account which now amounted to over 10 per cent. of the paid up capital of the Company. It was also shown that the gross earnings of the Company had been largely augmented, and that there had been a good increase of business and profits. The increased earnings and business of the Company were most satisfactory to him, and the complete character of the statement presented by the Manager to the Shareholders was a subject for congratulation.

The Report was unanimously adopted, many of the Shareholders present expressing their confidence in the management and continued success of the Company.
