England Sore on Chicago Canned Stuff—Canadian Resolutions Adopted.

F. G. Morley and Noel Marshall, the Toronto delegates to the Congress of Chambers of Commerce of the Empire, arrived in the city yesterday after a delightful trip and a grand time.

When seen by The World last night Secretary Morley was enthusiastic. Canada and Canadians have at last made a great hit with the mother country.

"In reference to trade," continued Mr. Morley, "everything is booming. The Englishman is not slow to take advantage of a bargain. It is true they do not make a great spiel about their business deals, but they get there slowly and surely just the same. All deals are put thru without blowing of trumpets.

"As far as the congress itself was concerned, there was a great success, and many of the Canadian resolutions were adopted. There has been a great change in the attitude of British manufacturers towards preferential trade, and that resolution was carried with overwhelming majority when, six years ago, it was defeated, and even three years ago was hacked to pieces before a compromise could be arrived at.

"The clear store of J. W. McDonald, which has been frequently visited by thieves, was broken into again Thursday night. It was also broken into just a week previous.

"It has been estimated that if a new intake pipe for the waterworks were laid out into the lake it would cost the city \$1,000,000. There is an agitation on foot to develop the water power of the Niagara River, and it is said to be a game to give the Toronto & Niagara Power Co. a cheap right of way across the filtering basin property.

"The hospital governors today received the prices for running electric elevators, etc., in the hospital from the Cataract Power Company, and they were such that the governors would sign a contract for only one year. Hamilton, Aug. 3.—(Special)—The committee named to investigate the charges made against the filtering basins inspected them this afternoon and found them to be in first-class shape. It was found that the conduit pipe leading from the northern basin to the pump-house, thru which it was charged water from a creek got into the city water mains was not used, and was closed by two valves that prevented the creek water from getting into the system by any possibility.
