D'ALTON MCCARTHY'S WILL.

Valued at \$68,000—Details of the Dispositions—A Recent Codicil.

will of the late D'Alton McCarthy, was entered for probate in the Surrogate Court yesterday by the Ontario Corporation, of which the testator was a shareholder. The will was dated July 31, 1886, and it is witnessed by S. McInnes, student-at-law, and Spence, clerk. A codicil to the will was made on Feb. 21, 1888. In the will McCarthy appoints the Trust Corporation of Ontario as executor and trustee of the estate. To Mrs. McCarthy is given the power of selecting whatever household effects she may desire to become the property absolutely. The plate and plated articles and pictures are to be divided between Mrs. McCarthy and her daughter, and after her death, in trust for D'Alton Lally McCarthy, absolute.
