AS TO EARLY CLOSING.

An Appeal to Judge Price at Kingston Decided in Favor of Those Who Want to Keep Open.

Kingston, Dec. 12.—Some days ago Chas. Ricknell was fined by the Police Magistrate for a breach of the early closing law. He appealed, and Judge Price quashed the conviction. Ricknell keeps a grocery store and also sells meat. He claimed he kept his store open to dispose of meat and groceries.

In rendering judgment, Judge Price rebuked the majority for tyrannizing over the minority. It was a hardship for the grocers to prevent the smaller dealers seeking to earn a livelihood by keeping their shops open as late as they saw proper. If they desired to work at night, the law should not prevent them. In his judgment he was not guided by technicalities, but by the spirit rather than the letter of the statute.

Manufacturers' Trade Index. The Canadian Manufacturers' Association have made arrangements for the publication of a trade index for distribution at the Glasgow and Pan-American Exhibitions next year. The index, which will consist of 400 pages, will contain the names of all arranged manufacturers, and the goods they manufacture, and the names of all arranged importers.

The book will be published in the English, French and Spanish languages. The association will issue 20,000 copies at a cost of \$5,000.
