LONG TRIP UNDER SEA

Submarine Cruiser Made Voyage of 300 Miles Under Surface.

New York, July 3.—One of the greatest feats of torpedo boat activity was accomplished when, after making a submerged voyage of 325 miles, the boat Lake, a submarine cruiser, anchored off Atlantic Highlands with all aboard safe and sound.

The Lake left Norfolk at 2:15 o'clock on the afternoon of June 25, and with the exception of a few moments off Cape Henry, when she stopped to signal Mr. Lake, the inventor, and again when off Barnegat the crew shut down for a time to watch a school of whales, the engines were kept going at a speed of seven knots. 
