## BOLSHEVIKI MOWED DOWN BY AMERICAN GUNNERS IN ARCTIC

Enemy Ranks Break and Take To Woods.

**REDS' PLAN THWARTED**  
Flank Attack Which Was To Have Been Launched Is Abandoned.

ARCHANGEL, Feb. 5.—(By the Associated Press.)—Heavy losses were inflicted on the Bolsheviks by the American forces Tuesday and the enemy was back in disorder from the village of Vistavka on the Vaga. The American casualties were killed and several wounded. Many Bolshevik soldiers were taken prisoner. The enemy began early in the morning a flank attack with field guns and howitzers, and under cover of a shrapnel and pom-pom barrage, essayed a frontal attack with infantry in the arctic twilight at 3 o'clock in the afternoon. The American troops, who were rested after their retirement from Shenkursk, and were now established in good positions, poured a heavy fire from artillery and machine guns into the charging Bolsheviks, whose ranks broke and fled in confusion.

**Abandon Flank Attack.**  
Captured Bolsheviks declared that they had planned a flank attack simultaneously with the frontal attack, but this was abandoned when the Vistavka attempt failed. Chinese and Manchurian troops are now included in the Bolshevik force opposing the Americans on the Vaga. So far these have been held in reserve, but they are now preparing for a warm reception for the yellow soldiers if they appear in the fighting line, in view of their treatment of the Manchurian treatment of prisoners in the Baltic provinces.

**French Squad's Bravery.**  
Details were received at headquarters today of the bravery displayed by a little squad of about fifteen Frenchmen who were victims of an enemy raid on the village of Bolshole Osera Monday. Mistaking the enemy for returning Russian prisoners of war the French detachment, consisting of the Bolsheviks to advance close to their position. Then they found themselves suddenly surrounded by a force of 150 of the enemy. Called upon to surrender, the Frenchmen refused, and tried to fight their way out. Four of them were killed, three were wounded and six were unaccounted for at the time. Four of the six turned up today, two of them wounded, apparently having escaped from their captors.

The situation is unchanged on the Divina and railroad fronts. Entente forces were again forced to retire in face of the Bolshevik attacks along the Pinea River, but the positions of the Americans at the town of Pinea have not been attacked.

**DETROIT TO RIDE IN AUTO BUSES LIKE N. YORK AND LONDON**  
Gasoline Motors Will Carry 44 Passengers on the Main Streets.

DETROIT, Feb. 5.—An auto bus line, similar to the noted Fifth avenue transportation system of New York, is projected for this city with one hundred busses to begin operation.

**BRITISH COLUMBIA LIBERALS WILL HOLD FEDERAL CONVENTION**

VANCOUVER, Feb. 5.—A federal Liberal convention for the province of British Columbia will be called at an early date.

This provision was made yesterday at a meeting between Senator Bostock, leader of the Liberal party in the Senate, and representatives from most of the federal constituencies on the mainland.

**PREACHER NOT GUILTY OF MURDERING WIFE, IS VERDICT OF JURORS**

SACO, Me., Feb. 5.—A verdict of not guilty was the finding of the jury in the trial of Henry H. Hall, the preacher, accused of the murder of his wife, Minnie, on the 11th of June of last year. The verdict was returned late tonight after the jury had spent more than ten hours in deliberation.

**LONDON WOMAN BURIED AT NILESTOWN**

NILESTOWN, Feb. 5.—The church choir met last practice night at the home of Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Gibbons. At an interval of rest Mrs. Gibbons handed out a treat that came from California.

While the offering was being taken last Sunday night, A. E. Bernard sang a solo. Then instead of singing the last hymn the preacher, Mr. McArthur, London, asked that the last stanza of the solo be repeated, and the audience joined in the refrain.

**GODERICH MAGISTRATE DEFERS DECISION IN LIQUOR CASE**

GODERICH, Feb. 5.—The liquor case against Bert Townsend, which was adjourned a week ago, came up yesterday and was argued by Crown Attorney Seamer and M. G. Cameron for the defendant. The case lasted about an hour.

Mr. Cameron argued that Mr. Townsend had a perfect right to go to London with a bona fide doctor's prescription and carry liquor into this county. The magistrate said he would give his decision on February 12.

**GERMAN MINISTER TO HUNGARY.**  
BASEL, Feb. 5.—Johann Junker has been appointed German minister to the Hungarian republic, according to the official journal of Budapest.

## MONEY IN SHEEP

STROME, Alta., Feb. 5.—From 100 sheep purchased in the fall of 1916 for \$1,200, a farmer here has sold wool valued at \$1,396 and mutton worth \$1,040. He has now 224 head, valued at \$2,808, so that the farmer's remuneration for two years from this source amounts to over \$5,000.

**Canadians Reviewed in Brussels; Will Soon Leave Belgium**

BRUSSELS, Feb. 5.—Canadian Press. via Reuters.—Gen. Jacques today reviewed the Canadians under the command of Gen. Bonnet, who are leaving the occupied territories and returning home. Thousands of persons watched the review and loudly cheered the troops.

**INGERSOLL WOMAN'S SISTER GETS THIRD DECORATION IN WAR**

Mrs. M. Eaton Adds Another Medal To French Medal and Mons Star.

INGERSOLL, Feb. 5.—That her sister, Mrs. M. W. Eaton, has been awarded her third decoration for her work in France, is the word that has been received by Mrs. Stephen Noxon. Mrs. Eaton, although never a resident of Ingersoll, is widely known here. She was on leave in Canada at the time the 168th Battalion was being recruited and delivered a stirring address in the Mason Theatre, in which she described the excitement in Paris when the first news of the war was received there. In 1917 Mrs. Eaton received a medal from the French Government for her work in the American Ambulance Hospital at Neuilly, a suburb of Paris. She was also decorated with the Mons star and ribbon for her care of British soldiers in 1914. Her last decoration is in the form of a medal for her voluntary work in the Army and Navy League Club, also known as the "Trinity Jack Club" of Paris, where soldiers of Canada and United States are entertained.

**EIGHTY-ONE-YEAR BOY APPLAUDED SPEAKERS AT LIBERAL MEETING**
