

CIVIL SERVICE CONTRIBUTED A FULL BRIGADE

Statistics Show 4,800 Civil Servants Volunteered During War.

TWO VICTORIA CROSSES

204 Other Decorations Won Casualties Were About 1,700.

OTTAWA, Aug. 19.—More than 4,800 civil servants, or more than enough for a full brigade of four battalions, with several batteries of artillery besides it mobilized together for military service during the war, according to statistics published in The Canadian giving the civil service war record. It is admitted that the list of names is several hundred short of the total. The men listed were ex-volunteers and the thousands of the Government railways went to the front are not included. Several women of the civil service went overseas as nurses.

One civil servant became major-general, several brigadier-generals and many commanded infantry battalions or artillery brigades. Decorations won by civil servants numbered 204 and included two Victoria Crosses, 47 Military Crosses (with six bars), 33 D. S. O.'s (with eight bars), 25 Military Medals and eleven D. C. M.'s. Foreign decorations totaled 22.

The total casualties incurred were about 1,700 and the known dead, 477. There were 25 prisoners of war.

HUGE QUANTITIES OF HOARDED FOOD FOUND IN BOSTON

Will Be Reported To Federal Authorities.

SEIZURE CONTEMPLATED

Evidence of Discoveries To Be Presented To Federal Grand Jury.

BOSTON, Aug. 19.—District Attorney Pelletier today announced that investigators had discovered more than 5,000,000 pounds of sugar in storage at a warehouse in the Charlestown district. As the state laws make no provision for action against hoarders of foodstuffs the district attorney instructed the inspectors to report their findings immediately to federal authorities. Millions of pounds of butter and cheese, and 14,000,000 dozens of eggs also have been found in warehouses here by agents of the department of justice. It was said, seizure of some of the great stocks of food is said to be contemplated by the federal officials. Evidence of the discoveries is to be presented to a federal grand jury which was convened today in special session. Inquiry into the large stocks of food found here developed, according to federal agents, that virtually all export orders had been filled, and that the supplies on hand were held for domestic use.

MINERS MUST DROP O.B.U. CONVENTION TO BE REINSTATED

B. C. and Alberta Mines Will Soon Be Working Normally.

WINNIPEG, Man., Aug. 19.—Senator G. D. Robertson, federal minister of labor, is in the city today on his way east. He arrived this morning from Calgary, which he visited in connection with the strikes in the coal mines at Drumheller, Fernie, Banff and Lethbridge.

Senator Robertson said that the strikers were rapidly going back to work and that the end of the present week would see all the mines running under normal conditions. No men are being taken back who refuse to drop all connection with the O. B. U. Senator Robertson said his visit to the city was of an unofficial nature. He denied that he was in connection with the refusal of bail to the leaders of the recent general strike or the detention of them.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF WHEAT PRICE HAS CAUSED SURPRISE

But Figure Decided Upon Is Considered Generally a Fair One.

OTTAWA, Aug. 19.—The announcement made by Sir George Foster yesterday that the initial price of wheat to the farmers of Canada would be \$2.15 per bushel on the basis of No. 1 northern, Fort William, has been received with some surprise at the capital, because of the forecast from the West that the price would be somewhat between \$2.20 and \$2.25. In Government and official circles, as far as can be gathered the price decided upon by the wheat control board and approved by the Government, apparently without hesitation, is considered to be a fair one when all things are considered. In some quarters the opinion is expressed that in fixing the price as high as \$2.15 the Government is taking some chance of experiencing a loss in connection with the handling of the season's wheat crop. On the other hand, if the average price secured is higher than \$2.15, the farmers under the arrangement will receive the balance of the sum realized at the end of the season. According to reports in circulation here, arrangements are likely to be made whereby a considerable percentage of the exportable Canadian wheat crop will be sold to the British Government direct.

AUTO THEFTS REACH ASTOUNDING SCALE

NEW YORK, Aug. 19.—Declaring that automobile stealing has reached an "astounding scale," Chief Clerk Frank Oliver of the New York magistrates' court, today sent invitations to police officials of hundreds of cities to co-operate in a wholesale drive against automobile thieves. Through co-operation of insurance companies, a clearing house for stolen automobile information will be established, to which the police departments of all cities are requested to send descriptive lists of missing cars.

MEETING OF GAS MEN WILL HAVE BEARING ON FUEL SITUATION
