ST. JOHN AMBULANCE OVERSEAS BRIGADE ATTENDS ST. ANDREW'S

The St. John Ambulance Brigade Overseas attended St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in a body last night with Mrs. J. B. McKillop, lady commissioner for this district, at their head. The service was adapted for them, the Rev. D. G. Macdonald, preaching on Christ's life as it was devoted to helping others and healing them in their sickness.

He likened the work of the order to that of Christ, pointing out that before Christianity began, there were no institutions for the amelioration of the suffering. "The Order of St. John of Jerusalem dates back to the eleventh century, and it was the beginning of the St. John Ambulance Association," he declared. "Out of it has grown the modern Red Cross Association."

"This organization teaches men how to serve others, and is therefore a Christian order. Its members go about rendering first-aid to the injured just as Jesus did in Jerusalem," he said. Before closing, he mentioned the splendid work of the order during the war, 400 of its men assisting in the Canadian Army Medical Corps and very many V. A. D. nurses.
