TO DYE BLUE .-- A splendid blue may be produced in an hour by the following process:-For each pound of wool or cloth take two and a half ounces of alum and one ounce and a half of cream of tar-Boil these together in a brass or copper kettle for about an hour; now take sufficient warm water to cover the cloth or wool, and color it to the shade you wish with the liquid blue; put the whole into the copper pot and boil it a short time, taking care to keep it stirred; re move the cloth and rinse it in clear cold water, and hang it up to dry
