The Committee, in accordance with prospectus, give orders upon their Treasurer semi-annually for amount sufficient to meet deficit in S. P. G. grant. As clergymen are appointed to fill vacancies that may occur in S. P. G. list, a sum equal to three fourths of that named on prospectus will be granted, three fourths of the amount named as basis of the scheme having been realized, first reducing the number in class one from 21 to 16 to meet an error in prospectus in its calculation of the amount of revenue £40,000 would yield.
