BUSINESS QUIET IN DOMINION

THE FOURTH WIFE OF CHIEF RED CROW DEAD

Lethbridge, Dec. 11.—The death at the
Galt hospital, here, of the Indian
squaw, Mrs. Red Crow, removes an as-
sociation linked with the fame of Red
Crow, a renowned warrior chief of the
Blood Indians, whose name is still re-
garded with reverence in that it was
passed onto the Prince of Wales when
in his visit to Lethbridge, he was cre-
ated a chief of the Bloods by the Indians
at that time assembled in the city. The
late Mrs. Crow was the fourth wife
of the famous Red Crow, who died some 20
years ago.

HARDING BEGINS HIS CONFERENCE ON FOREIGN POLICY OF UNITED STATES

Marion, Ohio, Dec. 11.—In fulfillment

States foreign policy, President-elect
Harding began a month of conference
here by seeking the advice of Charles
Evans Hughes, republican nominee for
the presidency in 1916.
