

London, Dec. 11—Ten Persian carpets that once adorned the Czar's summer palace are being offered for sale in London at £500. The carpets are said to have been rescued from the Bolsheviki, but nothing has been allowed to leak out except that they were brought to England a few weeks ago by a British cruiser. Their age is some 120 years. They were presented to Alexander I. by the Shah of Persia, and subsequently were given to the Prince of Oldenburg, who is the father of the present owner.
