MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRE

Hon. F. D. Monk, a member of Premier Borden's ministry when it was first formed and who resigned because of ill health, has recuperated, and will be back in the house next session.

He did not appear in the house all last session because of poor health.

The British steamer Rio Colorado reached London on Saturday having on board the crew of the three masted schooner "Benedict" of Kingsport, N. S., which had been abandoned in mid-Atlantic after being dismantled.

It is said that about 400,000 bushels of potatoes are stored in Carleton and Victoria counties and, owing to the abundant crop in Ontario this year, there is little chance of marketing them because of the American embargo placed on native "spuds".

One shipper in Woodstock has said that he feels the price will drop to forty cents a barrel. Orders for hundreds of tons of fertilizer have been cancelled.

William Henry Irving, of Montreal, was chosen on Saturday by the faculty of Mount Allison University as Rhodes Scholar from that institution for 1914.

He has a particularly good record. He led his class list in twenty, and came second in fourteen subjects and won several scholastic distinctions as well.

The body of Game Warden Paul Cloutier, of Notre Dame du Lac, Temiscouata, who disappeared two weeks ago, has been found by divers at the bottom of Lake Squateck. Four bullet wounds in his forehead show that he was the victim of foul play.
