THE FLURRY IN MONEY London, Dec. 12.—Although an advance in the bank rate was not expected today the directors of the Bank of England were longer than usual in deciding to leave the rate unchanged. The hesitation was due to the flurry in money on the continent and the depletion of nearly £2,000,000 in the reserve. It is anticipated if the continental money situation, Berlin and Paris selling today in connection with the slump in St. Petersburg the money stringency and the political situation weakened next sections, and although the settlement was concluded satisfactorily the markets closed weak at the low point. The weakness in New York caused some uneasiness. But dealers here are not largely concerned.

HUSBAND AND WIFE DROWN Keene, N. H., Dec. 12.—A double drowning tragedy occurred at East Sullivan, when Mr. and Mrs. Frank L. Fifield, prominent residents of the town, were drowned as the result of breaking through the ice while skating on the Bolster Pond. The bodies were recovered.

Mr. and Mrs. Fifield, accompanied by their two daughters, Bernice, aged ten and Rux P., aged 8, and a school teacher went skating together, and Mrs. Fifield broke through the thin ice and cried for help. In attempting to rescue his wife, Mr. Fifield went into the water, and neither was able to reach shore.

Police records show that in the fourteen months from June 1, 1911, to August 1, 1912, there were 974 arrests on charges of keeping gambling houses or operating gambling devices in New York. 270 cases went to court; 133 persons were convicted; 114 paid fines aggregating \$23,610, and only one person received a jail sentence.
