McCarty's Death One of Four in Various Lines of Sport

There were three deaths in the sporting world in one recent week. In fact there were four within seven days. Luther McCarty, the title holder in the heavy weight ranks, died from the effects of a blow over the heart in his fight with Arthur Pelkey at Calgary, Canada; Julius Sims, a young motorcycleist killed in a race at Cleveland, O.; Vance Fought, twenty years of age, killed by being hit on the head with a baseball while a young man was killed in Michigan by being hit with a baseball.

Little or no attention was given to the young men killed in the baseball games, and a mere mention was made of the youth killed in the motor races, while the one who goes to prove that there must be unusual interest in the boxing game or the papers would not give so much space to a matter of that kind when they can pass other events on the same plane with a mere "notice." The promoters who permitted the young man to ride at Cleveland, knowing that he was not at his best, were just as responsible as the promoters at Calgary who permitted McCarty to go into the ring without a medical examination. In the cases of the young men killed in the baseball games, it was a little different, as they were accidents without a doubt.

It might be mentioned, too, that men are killed in mills, shops or mines daily, through carelessness or defects, but the people who are killed in the ring are not killed in a prize ring. From all the data at hand there is no doubt that Luther McCarty had no business in the ring that day, as a man in good health could not possibly have succumbed to a blow over the heart or under the heart, which was the case with McCarty. (Department of Agriculture, Ottawa)

A decrease of labor with no diminution of income, but with general improvement of results, is a combination which appeals to any one. Labor-saving machinery and thoroughly efficient machines might just as well be used by dairy farmers as by any manufacturer. So the question comes: Have we efficient cows? Do they save or make work? Are they so good that they decrease both comparatively and actually the necessary amount of labor in keeping cows, and at the same time increase the income? Every dairy farmer needs to answer such questions as applied to his herd, and he can answer them satisfactorily when he keeps dairy records.

A statement made by the dairy division, Ottawa, regarding Ontario cows last year, was that dairymen are keeping sixteen cows to do the work of ten. So it is quite possible to cut down work one-third, and rejoice because possessing more efficient cows. To the scrap-heap with the old junk.
