Authorities Blamed In Sydney Death

CLAIMS U. S. REAL **WORLD WAR VICTOR**

SYDNEY, N. S., Dec. 21—Found dead by his eleter yesterday afternoon in Ms home, a log hut on French Road in the district of Gabarus, N. S., the body of Lauchlin MacNell, 70, was brought to Sydney tonight where an inquest was held by Coroner J. C. Townsend resulting in a verdict of "death through lack of nourishment, exposure to frost and organic diseases."

The jury added a recommendation, "that the authorities be held responsible under the Poor Act, for the neglect of one Lauchlin MacNeil.

Tchitcherin Asserts He Foresaw Conflict Between America and Great Britain


