## OFFICIAL DECISIONS, 1898.

- (1) Lodge Shakespeare.—Would a member initiate at the age of 45 be charged 15c per week or 13c? Answer—The member must pay 15c a week.
- (2) Lodge Enfield.—Is a member entitled to sick benefits who does not comply with section 376, page 105, of the constitution? Answer—No; the constitution must be carried out. A member on the sick list should not be out of doors after six o'clock during the winter months.
- (3) Lodge Commercial.—Does a commercial traveller come under the class of hazardous risk? Answer—No; he is not liable for the increased assessments.
- (4) Lodge Tennyson.—Can a White Rose Degree member in good standing in the Red Rose Degree be admitted into the White Rose Degree meeting while he is suspended in that Degree? Answer—Yes, unless there is some charge against him.
- (5) Lodge Thames.—Can the lodge admit a candidate who is over 50 years of age? Answer—No, not as a financial member, but he may be admitted as an honorary member.
