PENNSYLVANIA ROUTES INDIANS

Carlisle Administered a Severe Defeat Saturday by Pennsylvania--Harvard Defeats West Point, and Yale Wins from Amherst--Serious Injury at West Point--Free Fight at Philadelphia.

Philadelphia, Oct. 30.—The University of Pennsylvania severely defeated the Carlisle Indians today in one of the best fought games ever played on Franklin field, the score being 20 to 6. For the first time in the history of that famous athletic field, an official was physically attacked by a player and a policeman was called upon to escort the offending man and the coach of the Carlisle team behind the lines.

The trouble occurred in the middle of the first half. Wauzeka was ordered out of the game on the ground that he had roughly tackled a Pennsylvania man who was out of bounds. Enraged at Umpire Edwards' action, Wauzeka attacked the official, and struck him a hard blow on the jaw. Other players quickly stopped further hostilities.

Left Tackle Fretz, of Pennsylvania, then came to Edwards' assistance, and his remarks and actions were such as to cause the officials to order him from the game. About the same time Warner came running on the field. There was an argument and then Edwards summoned policemen and had both Wauzeka and Warner escorted behind the lines. In the argument it was asserted by Pennsylvania authorities, Warner declared that Oskeson, of Lehigh, was not fair to the Indians. When this was brought to Warner's attention he said he did not charge Oskeson with giving the other side the game, but said that he told Oskeson that he had given Pennsylvania a touchdown when he had not earned it. Warner also said that he told Oskeson he was doing all he could for Pennsylvania. Later in the same half, an Indian who is said to have been a former player, was removed from the side lines by Edwards for alleged offensive remarks.
