


AMES HOLDEN M'CREADY CO. POSSESS A FINE WAREHOUSE

Is Most Modern Building of its Kind in City—Fitted with Latest Appliances—Marks New Building Era in St. John.



The above is a fine picture of the big new warehouse of the Ames Holden McCreedy Company Ltd. It may with truth be said it fairly represents the forward movement in St. John, and is the first of a number of modern buildings to be erected here by local and outside firms to provide facilities to handle on the most approved lines their large and constantly growing business.

The construction of this fine warehouse, marking the new era of building in St. John, will be followed very long by other big buildings in the same locality, those of Messrs. Vassie & Co. and the McClary Company probably being started as soon as spring opens.

Spring Moving at City Hall. With the spring approaching the moving fever is affecting the city contractors, and there will be changes at city hall. Arrangements are being made to make two offices in Com. Wignome's room, one for the accommodation of his clerk, the clerk's office of the water and sewerage department will also be divided into two offices. Mr. Wignome will occupy one, and Com. Wignome will occupy the other. It is understood the city engineer will occupy the present office of Com. Wignome.

On the main floor, entered from Canterbury street, are the main offices, beautifully finished in cypress brought from the Southern States, and in heavier mahogany and presenting a very pleasing effect. In fact, it may be doubted if there is in the city a more attractive set of offices, large and airy, well lighted, and beautifully finished. Opening off these are the two sample rooms, connecting by an open arch, in which are displayed the various lines of footwear manufactured by the Ames Holden McCreedy Co. in their three factories, and comprising all the lines worn by men, boys, women and girls, as well as the different rubber goods manufactured by the houses they represent, and right here it might be said that the display is an unusually striking and pleasing one, calculated to cause surprise that goods of this kind can make such an attractive appearance.

Besides the beautiful offices and sample rooms, this floor is the receiving and shipping room for the McCreedy Brand of goods, and the big warehouse space has made it possible to so arrange the shelving that the goods are displayed in order of their numbers, an arrangement that is particularly advantageous and prevents all confusion and reduces to a minimum the work of the staff.

The second floor above the street is given over to the Ames Holden McCreedy, and here the same arrangement is followed as obtains on the floor below with reference to the arrangement of the goods to the most favorable advantage.

The third floor has the simple stock and case goods, the fourth floor the rubber line, while the top floor is for emergency stock, travellers' samples, etc.

MAKING ENQUIRIES REGARDING ST. JOHN

Acting Secretary of Board of Trade Gets Requests for all Sorts of Information about Conditions.

That St. John as a possible site for new manufacturing industries is attracting more and more attention is indicated by the number of letters coming into the board of trade, asking for information about all kinds of conditions here. Some of the manufacturers want information of the kind that would show just what there was in the boom here; such information for instance, as the number of passengers carried in the street cars for years past, the building permits, bank clearings, local customs receipts, attendance at schools, housing conditions, cost of beefsteak, taxes, etc., etc.

As the board has not kept any record of these things, the answering of the letters places a large amount of labor on the acting secretary.

HIGH PRICES PAID FOR TIMBER LIMITS

Crown Land Department Realize \$9,007.50 on Sale of Twelve Berths in Salmon and Gaspereaux River.

Fredericton, Feb. 26.—At the Crown Land department this morning, \$9,007.50 was realized on a sale of twelve timber berths in the Salmon and Gaspereaux rivers districts in Queens and Kent counties.

There was active bidding, John E. Sayre, of St. John bidding in seven of the berths for Messrs. Sayre and Holly, St. John, while G. G. Baird, Chipman, Queens county, bid in the remaining four, and it is said that Messrs. D. Fraser and Sons of this city are interested with him.

Competition between the bidders is said to have been responsible for the active bidding. The top price paid was \$200, which Mr. Baird bid for three square miles on Salmon river. The other prices ranged from \$70 per mile upwards.

Messrs. Sayre and Holly bought berths as follows: Three square miles at \$110; six square miles at \$150; eight and a half square miles at \$150; three and a half square miles at \$146; two square miles at \$151; three square miles at \$130; eight square miles at \$141; and ten square miles at \$141.
