THE ALLAN LINE. The Allan liner Stellan was one hundred miles east of Cape Race at 11 o'clock yesterday morning and is due in Quebec this afternoon, and in Montreal tomorrow.

A HEAVY LIFT. Captain Butt, the commander of the steamer Bray Head, which recently arrived under charter of the Robert Reford Company, Ltd., was a happy man Saturday evening and is receiving the congratulations of his friends along the harbor front. A boiler weighing twenty-one and a half tons was brought out on the steamer from Glasgow to be put on board the tug Lord Kitchener. It is said to be the heaviest lift ever attempted in this port and a special derrick was brought out for the purpose of handling the boiler. It just took an hour and a half to do the work and the big boiler was lifted from the Bray Head without a mishap.

THE ST. GEORGE. The C. P. R. liner St. George, which is to go on the Bay route sailed from Halifax last evening and is due here today.

AN OLD ENGLISH HOLIDAY

For over two centuries the fifth of August was a holiday in England, commemorating the "miraculous escape" from death of James VI, of Scotland, afterwards James I, of England. It was on August 5, 1603, that Alexander Ruthven, a younger brother of John Ruthven, Earl of Gowrie, sought an audience with the King, and told him an extraordinary tale of having observed a man burying a pot of money in a field.

THE PRECEDING EARL OF GOWRIE had at one time taken James a prisoner, and held him a captive in his castle for ten months, and for this was executed. It was to revenge his father that the Earl and Ruthven made the attempt on the life of the King. After the Earl was dead, the ruler and his savors knelt on the floor and thanked God for their deliverance. Long afterwards the fifth of August was celebrated as a day of thanksgiving, but the custom has died out.

POST OFFICE LOOTED AT HOPEWELL HILL

Thieves Secured Entry Through Window and Pried Cash Drawer Open—Cash had been Removed

Hopewell Hill, Aug. 4.—Under cover of darkness and the rumbling of an approaching thunderstorm two robbers were committed on Friday night at Hopewell Hill, when the post office and one of the general stores were entered. As early as 11 o'clock sounds were heard by people living in the vicinity of the post office, but these were attributed to the weather, and no further notice was taken of them, but it is since thought the building was being broken into then, as two panes of glass and the connecting piece of sash were removed from a six-pane sash window and entrance of effect in that way.

The sash had been pried open by chisels and iron taken from an adjoining shop, and two one hundred cent rolls were taken, there being no other money left in it by the postmaster. The stamps had been sorted, but none were taken.

The general store was entered by breaking one of the glass panels in the door and removing one of several iron bars which had been placed inside by the owner on account of burglars committing a year ago. No cash was found here, but some articles of merchandise were stolen.
