

NORTHUMBERLAND GIVES \$30,000 TO THE PATRIOTIC FUND

Newcastle, Jan. 21.—Northumberland county council yesterday passed resolutions: (1) Of loyalty to the King and the Empire, and the determination to fight it out "until the enemy is thoroughly subdued, and the principles for which our country is contending are accepted as irrevocable, so that no country in the future will be able to work injury upon a lesser power or endanger the peace and fundamental interests of Christian society." (2) Thanking the women for Red Cross, Belgian Relief and other work; (3) Congratulating the boys at the front and assuring them that their dependents will be looked after; and (4) Concluding with the survivors of dead heroes.

These resolutions were followed up with a grant of \$30,000 for the Canadian Patriotic Fund, to be borrowed on bonds and paid out as required.

The funeral of the late Private D. S. Gordon, Jr., of Maple Glen was held from his parents' home, yesterday afternoon, Rev. Dr. Hanson conducting services at house and grave. The funeral was the largest ever seen in Maple Glen. Lieut. De La Parelle and 60 soldiers from the 73rd and 132nd attended, and sent a beautiful wreath.
