**LAW SCHOOL GRADUATE
MAY BE CANDIDATE
IN NEXT ELECTION**

**W. S. Kennedy a Graduate of
King's College Law School,
Mentioned as Candidate.**

The many friends of W. S. Kennedy in St. John will be pleased to learn that he is mentioned as a candidate in the next election for the county of Colchester. Mr. Kennedy graduated from the St. John Law School last spring and has been practicing his profession in Truro. The Headlight, a paper published in the interest of the railway men on the political situation, says:

"In the event of a general election soon the political pot in Colchester county will be boiling. It is stated on the highest authority that many of the leading Conservatives desire that W. S. Kennedy, B.C.L., be a candidate for the Dominion house. Dr. J. H. uncle, R. H. Kennedy, M.P.P., seeks election for the Dominion house, then Mr. W. S. Kennedy will be a candidate for the provincial house."

"There is also a possibility that he might run as a third candidate—an independent Conservative. If such should be the case, he would almost command the political arena. Mr. Kennedy has always been looked upon by his friends as a coming politician in Colchester. He is an able debater, a lawyer by profession, and it will take an able man to hold his own with him on the platform."

"And, he would almost control the railway vote in Truro, as he has always stood through thick and thin for the men along the rails. There is no politician in the country who knows railway men and officers better than Mr. Kennedy and for this reason they would support him."

"Asked by Headlight concerning the above, Mr. W. S. Kennedy's only reply was: 'There might be something in it.'"

BIG PRICES PAID.

Boston brokers have just disposed of several vessels at prices which would not have been considered possible when conditions were normal.

The three-masted schooner Jeremiah Smith, 336 tons net and 29 years old, was sold by the Cranston Worsted Company of Providence to H. S. Lord of this city, for \$27,000. She will be placed in the South American trade.

The Emma S. Briggs, also a three-masted schooner, built at Viscasset 35 years ago and registering 244 tons net, was sold by the Boston Ship Brokerage Company to New York City.

She will be used in the Gulf of Mexico trade. The fishing schooner Bay State, 153 tons gross built at Gloucester in 1912, was purchased by David W. Simpson of Boston for \$22,000, and will take on cargo for Newfoundland.
